True reconciliation starts with you and I...

Meet PJ Cole one of the One Young World ambassadors who, is making a life by making a difference to the lives of others...

Imagine you survived fighting as a child soldier during an 11-year civil war, and then escaped the killer Ebola virus in young adulthood, only to face a future ravaged by climate change and economic desolation.



More than a generation of young Sierra Leoneans have grown up in the shadow of death, yet PJ Cole remains convinced that these "victims can become victors". And he should know, having grown up in a household of former child soldiers who were rescued from the streets by his compassionate father, the late Reverend Richard Cole.

Now aged 30, PJ - is helping these battle-scarred young individuals on a path to becoming teachers, medics, police officers and business leaders. As a director of the Lifeline Nehemiah Project he oversees four schools, a 45-bed safe home and a vocational training centre that is working with 317 people in Sierra Leone's capital.

"True forgiveness produces an amazing capacity for hope," and it is his belief that, former child soldiers would be the ones that would go on to rebuild a nation.

Five years ago, after attending Law School in the UK, PJ made the decision to follow his father's lead and work to rebuild Sierra Leone by investing in its disadvantaged youth. It is, he insists, "Those that are written off who can be the biggest contributors to society,"

Pj is no stranger to hardship in fact, during his childhood the school fees that were needed for his own education were used to help support the former young soldiers and he, had to do 'street-trading' to pay for food. Not easy, and at times, he admits, he felt resentful but now, he recognises that his unique upbringing taught him how enemies could become friends and that even children taught to kill could become valued members of society. "True reconciliation," he says "starts with you and I."

Last year, he was made a Queen's Young Leader and today, PJ is attempting to give unemployed Sierra Leoneans a reason for staying in the country and through the Lifeline Nehemiah project he is training 540 people in sustainable farming techniques in the village of Punduru, eastern Sierra Leone.
