# Classroom conversation guide

When learners are asked to express their own thoughts and opinions in a group environment, it is vital that everyone feels respected, safe and supported.

We recommend introducing the following rule as a guideline for your classroom. It is a rule that has guided humanity for <u>over 3000 years</u>:

# Treat other people in the way you would like to be treated.

You may choose to build on this by establishing a set of shared values.

The following are adapted from The PSHE Association's ground rules. You can use these or create a list of your own.

## AS A CLASS, WE AGREE TO BE...

#### **HONEST**

We will be open to learning and honest about our opinions.

But if we don't feel like participating in an activity or a question, then we have the right to pass.

## **CURIOUS**

We will ask questions about anything we're not sure about.

If we need help, support or advice we will seek it out – either in school, at home or online.

### RESPECTFUL

If someone else is speaking we will listen to what they have to say.

We will try to use the proper words for what we're discussing instead of slang.

## **ENCOURAGING**

If our friends need support, we will help them to find it.

### **KIND**

We will not put anybody down or judge their opinions.

We can disagree with people's point of view, but we will only discuss it in a constructive and non-personal way.

## **ACCEPTING**

We won't make assumptions about people's values, attitudes, feelings, life experiences or behaviours.

We will accept people's explanations and points of view without prejudice.

### **TRUSTWORTHY**

We won't speak about what is discussed outside of this safe space.

Our teacher will not repeat what we say in this classroom unless they are concerned about our safety.

## **COMPASSIONATE**

We will treat each other in the way we would like to be treated.
